Obituary of Samuel George's death on Oct. 28, 1889 in Sandy Lake News, Fri. Nov 1, 1889, page 5.

Mr. Samuel George, an esteemed citizen of sandy Lake, after a lingering illness of several weeks, died peacefully at his home, South Hill, this place at 8:10p.m., Monday, Oct. 28, 1889 aged 74 yrs and 2 months. He was born of pious parents, near Indiana, Pa., Aug. 28, 1815. He learned the moulder's trade, and at one time owned and operated a foundry in Indiana, Pa. There he resided till 1871, when he removed to Sandy Lake, where he had married in '42. He leaves a wife and one daughter in this place. Three sons, J.H. and Chas. B. George of Chicago and Dr. Wm. M. George, of Elkhart, Indiana, were present at the interment, which took place at 3 P. M., Wednesday, Oct. 30 at Oak Hill Cemetery. Another son, J.A. George of Pierceton, Ind., was unable to be present. The funeral service was held in the U. P. church of which he was a member and ruling elder up to his death, having united with the U. P. church of Indiana, Pa., some 47 yrs. ago. In this church he was a consistent and honored worshiper during all his life. His last end was peaceful and death came to him without alarm. Among his neighbors, Mr. George was universally esteemed for his quiet, orderly habits of life, his honesty and uprightness in business, and his many agreeable social qualities. In politics he was a Prohibitionist, having voted with the party since its first organization. The funeral services were conducted by his former pastor, Rev. L. I. Crawford, who spoke from Heb. 11 rev:2 "By it (faith) the elders obtained a good report." Rev. J. McDowell of the Presbyterian church, read Heb 11 Rev:0, L. Mead of the M. F. church. led in prayer, also Elder G.J. Massey of the Disciple church, who with the other brothers joined. All spoke briefly and in an impressive manner of the high esteem in which they held Mr. George. The pall bearers were A. McBride, Wm. Simcox, N. Amos, J.H. Hamilton, Wm. Begge and Harvey Vigan.

Sandy Lake has lost one of its best citizens, the church a true and trusted member and his family a father and husband who in all relations of life was conscientious and faithful.

The surviving widow and children have many claims of sympathy from our citizens in this hour of their sorrow and trying bereavement.

Mrs. Samuel George takes this method of returning her sincere thanks to the people of Sandy Lake for their kindness during the sickness and at the time of death of her husband on October 28, 89. The family joins her in this matter.
